Colonel David F. John is the Vice Director of the Joint Personnel Recovery Agency (JPRA), headquartered at Fort Belvoir, Virginia. JPRA is a Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Controlled Activity aligned under the Joint Staff Director for Joint Force Development (J7). JPRA leads DoD Personnel Recovery (PR) by providing strategic direction, oversight, operational support, analysis, capability development, training, and education to improve PR interoperability, enabling DoD, the interagency, and multinational partners to prevent, prepare for, and respond to isolating events.

Col John received his commission from the U.S. Air Force Academy in May 2001 and attended Euro-NATO Joint Jet Pilot Training at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas. He served as an F-15C instructor pilot at Langley Air Force Base, Virginia; an F-22 operational test pilot in the 422d Test and Evaluation Squadron at Nellis AFB, Nevada; an MQ-9 Director of Operations, evaluator pilot, and mission commander at Creech AFB, Nevada; the inaugural Commander of the 50th Attack Squadron at Shaw AFB, South Carolina, and Commander of the 432d Operations Group at Creech AFB. Col John has served as a strategist on both the Headquarters, U.S. Air Force Staff, and the Joint Staff. He has flown more than 2,300 hours, including missions in support of operations Noble Eagle, Northern Guardian, Enduring Freedom, Inherent Resolve, Odyssey Lightning and Freedom's Sentinel.
